### Unity Employment Services Consumer Taras Vrozack Recognized for Excellence by Scotsman *Pennysaver* Paper

**AUBURN** – Neither wind nor rain nor snow nor ice can keep Unity Employment Services (UES) consumer Taras Vrozack from delivering the weekly Auburn, N.Y. *Pennysaver* to that publication’s 360 customers who comprise his route on Auburn’s southwest side.

In recognition of Vrozack’s excellence in delivering the Auburn *Pennysaver*, its publisher, the Scotsman Press, awarded him its Carrier Excellence Award for the month of November 2008.

“We never get complaints from the 360 subscribers he delivers to, he always delivers his papers on time, and he just does an excellent job overall,” said Scotsman Press Circulation Coordinator Veronica Haag, in explaining her employer’s reasons for recognizing Vrozack. “These are all reasons why Taras is so deserving of the award.”

The friendly and outgoing Vrozack delivers 180 of his papers on Thursdays and the remaining 180 on Fridays, accompanied by his UES job coach Tom Hughes. Prior to hitting the road and delivering the papers on each day, the two take 45 minutes to an hour ‘sleeving’ each paper into a thin, plastic *Pennysaver* bag that protects it from the elements and facilitates its delivery.

“Taras has a really big route so splitting it into two days just makes sense and is far easier than trying to deliver to that many house in one day,” observed Hughes. “He delivers to some house off right on Route 38, some off of the northwest end of that route, plus houses in the Olympia Terrace and Brogan Manor areas. He is very good at delivering and he’s progressed to a high level of independence and can pretty much do all of it himself. He needs very little coaching, just a little bit here and there at times. I love working with him.”

Vrozack, who has held the route since the end of December 2007 and who since 2005 has held employment via UES with Auburn Party Rental and the Pioneer Restaurant in Auburn, usually finishes each day’s route in three hours.

When asked what about his unending dedication to his job and the secret to earning such recognition, Taras simply smiled and replied, “I really, really love my job and like getting all the papers delivered to the people.”
